Project Objectives and Implementation

PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The Rotary Foundation approved global grant funding to be used for the following project objectives:

The main barrier to dental care is geographic location after Taiwan's National Health Insurance was implemented in 1995. Tainan Municipal Dongshan District Dongyuan Elementary School, Sigang District Gangdong Elementary School, Guanmiao District Chonghe Elementary School, and Houbi District Ansi Elementary Schools are all located in remote areas of Tainan. The surrounding areas are Baihe, Nanxi, Danei, Liujia Villages. There is only 0.87 dentist per 10,000 population and most of the school children are single-parent and vulnerable people with low-income families. Parents are too busy to work and have no time to give extra care to their children. They have lower dental care utilization, higher rates of dental caries, higher rates of poverty, fewer dentists per population and greater distances to travel to access dental care than urban school. In order to improve the dental care for rural children, we require practical and flexible approaches to distribute the dentists, includes mobile dental equipment for providing timely dental treatment and oral health education. We plan to purchase dental care equipment in health centers of these four Elementary Schools. Dentists are periodic service to provide dental diagnosis and treatment of about the 1,000 children and staff, and also expand this resource service to the vulnerable residents.

The "Help A Child Smile" program is cover in-school dental care for providing more healthy school students are, the more self-confidence they have. They will have more bright smiles, cavity free and stay in class, so they can get the education they need.

To show his will for supporting the program of "Help A Child Smile" , the dentist Lin, Kei-Sheng, donated a secondhand dental patient chair. After evaluating and coordinating with the Southern Division of National Healthy Insurance Administration as well as the Tainan Dental Association , we chose Tainan Municipal Nanhua District Nanhua Elementary School located in remote areas of Tainan as the fifth target unit, and purchased mobile dental equipment for providing dental treatment and oral health education.

Have you made progress toward your project objectives?

Describe the progress you've made so far.

Since last November the dentists has started to use these dental equipment in these five elementary schools. The dentists provide periodically the dental diagnosis and treatment for about 1,000 children and the staff (more than 3 times per semester), also including the oral health education (2 times per semester) . Over the past two years due to the the COVID-19 pandemic , the dental service was not available for the local residents. As long as the infection number decreases and the citizen gradually go back to their normal lives, the dental service will also be expanded to the vulnerable residents in the future. So far, this program of "Help A Child Smile" has solved some main problems of these five elementary schools . It has not only improved the dental care for rural children but also provided a safe and comfortable environment for dentists to serve and children to access the dental service. This program has bridged the gap between urban and rural schools . In addition, this program provides children with easier access to the dental care.
