## Project Overview

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### **Tell us a little about your project. What are the main objectives of the project, and who will benefit from it?**

This project aims to establish dental treatment facilities to improve the quality of dental care on campuses and local healthcare units in 8 rural areas, including Daine Junior High School in Daine District, Zuozhen Junior High School in Zuozhen District, Nanhu Junior High School in Nanhua District, Kailiao Elementary School in Beimen District, and Shanshang Elementary School in Shanshang District, in Tainan City and Minhe Elementary School in Fanlu Township, Lijiao Township Clinic and Yongzhu Community medical station in Liujiao Township, in Chiayi County. The aforementioned schools and healthcare units all support the placement and maintenance of fixed facilities. The designated areas for installation meet the shortage of medical resources identified by National Health Insurance Administration (NHIA), therefore, NHIA has arranged for dentists to provide dental treatment services at the designated locations, and the cost of dentists' campus and healthcare units visits are all covered by NHIA. NHIA will supervise the healthcare facilities to ensure compliance with the plan's specifications and quality assessment.

Due to budget and environmental limitations, dental care on campuses often involves dentists carrying heavy equipment and setting up makeshift treatment areas in small health rooms, corners of offices, corridors, or other temporary locations. This arrangement often involves the use of makeshift chairs, long tables, and foldable chairs as treatment chairs. This challenging environment raises concerns about the quality and safety of both dental treatment services provided by dentists and the well-being of children undergoing treatment. In addition, the dental equipment in two rural healthcare units in Liujiao Township, Chiayi, has been in use for many years and urgently requires replacement due to wear and tear. Collaborative efforts across sectors to establish dental treatment facilities, along with environmental improvements and space enhancements, should increase dentists' willingness to provide services in remote areas.

In order to reduce the gap in medical resources between urban and rural areas and improve health inequality in remote regions, we plan to purchase dental care equipment for campuses and local healthcare units in these 8 rural areas of Tainan and Chiayi. The budget for this project is approximately \$99,000 USD. Collaborating with other regional Rotary clubs, we are donating dental treatment chairs with benevolent intentions, and joining hands with NHIA and the education sector to extend a helping hand. We hope to optimize the dental care environment and equipment by utilizing existing health insurance dental resources, allowing attending dentists, school children, and the public to have a more comfortable treatment environment. Through this effort, we aim to enhance the safety of medical visits for rural school children and residents, strengthen oral health care awareness, maintain good oral hygiene, promote health education, and increase the preservation rate of children's teeth. This initiative contributes to completing the puzzle of oral health care in rural areas and improve oral health care for about 70,550 rural residents and potentially expand medical resources to the community, benefiting residents in remote areas in the future.

## Why did you choose to partner with this organization and what will its role be?

There are three main reasons as follows:

- 1.The six schools and two rural medical stations are all located in remote districts of Chiayi and Tainan. The remote districts lack dental clinics and dentists. The population of the eight remote districts is about 70,550 but there are only 2 dentists providing.
- 2.The prevalence of caries in school children is higher than 53.02 percent. Therefore, we cooperate with the National Health Insurance Administration, to coordinate appropriate medical service institutions with national insurance to participate and support the project to improve the overall dental service. Then, we help to purchase dental equipment for providing timely dental treatment and oral health education.
- 3.We also cooperate with Chiayi and Tainan Dental Association, which help to send professional dentists in rotation to go to these schools to provide school children with good dental diagnosis and oral health care. Moreover, this dental service will expand to the disadvantaged residents in the nearby neighborhood to meet the need of the districts.

## **Describe the community needs that your project will address.**

- 1.1,000 students and staff can receive a comprehensive or periodic oral evaluation and treatment by offering convenient in-school dental care.
2. Provide school children and community vulnerable residents with timely dental care and oral hygiene education in schools to reduce the rate of dental caries.
3. Approximately 70,550 community residents can receive a comprehensive or periodic oral evaluation and treatment.

## **How did your project team identify these needs?**

The staff of the Southern Division of National Health Insurance Administration visited the principals of Dainei Junior High School in Dainei District, Zuozhen Junior High School in Zuozhen District, Nanhua Junior High School in Nanhua District, Kailiao Elementary School in Beimen District, Shanshang Elementary School in Shanshang District in Tainan, and Minhe Elementary School in Fanlu Township, Chiayi County, a medical station in Liujiao Township, Chiayi County, and a community health clinic in Yongzhu Community, Liujiao Township, Chiayi County to do field survey.

The investigation report is as follows:

1. According to the research, child outpatient rate of Tainan is 55% lower than that of the nation (57%). The main reason is school children in remote areas can't receive proper dental service because of the urban-rural gap. Even though the dentists are willing to go to school, limited by the insufficient equipment, they only make use of conference tables or desk chairs instead of dental chairs.
2. These six schools and two local health centers are located in remote towns, with inconvenient transportation and surrounded by fields. There are few medical clinics and dental clinics nearby. Most of the school children and residents are disadvantaged people or from low-income family. Parents are often busy with work and have no time to take care of them. Therefore, the prevalence of caries in school children is higher than 53.02%.
3. The proportion of the elderly population in the local community is quite high. When these vulnerable children and elderly residents have dental problems, they must go to distant towns or the city, so they usually delay or neglect the dental service due to various inconvenience such as transportation issues. The dental service of these vulnerable people is ignored for a long term and it is very important to have dental treatment resources to take care of their oral health.

## **How were members of the benefiting community involved in finding solutions?**

The remote area school children and community residents can be directly taken care of by in-school or in-local health-center based dental care. School-based or health-center-based provide access and treatment modalities to enable dentists to provide a range of dental care. It makes it easier for school children and residents to receive care because they don't have to travel to an appointment. Parents do not have to take time off to bring their children to the health care providers, and school children do not miss hours of school time sitting in a provider's office. Collaborative efforts across sectors to establish dental treatment facilities, along with environmental improvements and space enhancements, should increase dentists' willingness to provide services in remote areas.

## **How were community members involved in planning the project?**

School principals assist in propagating the dental treatment resources and ask for the village chief, local powerful people and relevant government departments to assist in propagating and letting more vulnerable residents know the in-school based dental center which will benefit more community residents in need.

School children and vulnerable residents have regular dental checkups to guide them on how to brush their teeth properly, apply fluoride, do checkup and treatment. Schools and two rural medical stations can cooperate with other groups including the government, non-profit organizations and private companies to increase efficiency.

**Please describe the training, community outreach, or educational programs this project will include.**

- 1.Regular dental service: Regular providing services include apply fluoride, strengthen the oral health education and practical operations of patients and caregivers.
- 2.Regular prevention: Propagate oral hygiene skills while having treatment and arrange time to check and clean teeth.
- 3.Resources connection: Connect with Chiayi County Dental Association and Tainan Dental Association, arrange dentists to schools and two rural medical stations regularly, coordinate with the surrounding area governor office to assist and provide service to the people in need and to propagate the dental service activities in the community regularly.
4. School children and local residents can participate in health education courses.

**How were these needs identified?**

Students and residents in rural areas face barriers to access dental service due to the geographic location and their caregiver with poor oral health literacy. We require practical and flexible approaches to distribute the dentists who are all experienced professionals in this field and include dentistry for providing dental services in rural areas.

Finally, assist with other organizations to expand dental service if necessary. The medical beneficiaries and the Rotary Club will not be charged.

#### Legal agreement

Global Grant Agreement - to be authorized by the primary contacts and club presidents (or DRFC chairs if district-sponsored)

This Global Grant Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International (TRF) and the grant sponsors (Sponsors). In consideration of receiving this Rotary Foundation Global Grant (Grant) from TRF, the Sponsors agree that:

1. All information contained in this application is, to the best of our knowledge, true and accurate.
2. We have read the Terms and Conditions for Rotary Foundation Global Grants (Terms and Conditions) and will adhere to all policies therein.
3. The Sponsors shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Rotary International (RI) and TRF, including their respective directors, trustees, officers, committee members, employees, agents, associate foundations and representatives (collectively Rotary), from and against all claims, including but not limited to claims of subrogation, demands, actions, damages, losses, costs, liabilities, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees and other legal expenses), awards, judgments, and fines asserted against or recovered from Rotary arising out of any act, conduct, omission, negligence, misconduct, or unlawful act (or act contrary to any applicable governmental order or regulation) resulting directly or indirectly from a Sponsor's and/or participant's involvement in grant-funded activities, including all travel related to the grant.
4. The failure of the parties to comply with the terms of this Agreement due to an act of God, strike, government regulation, war, fire, riot, civil unrest, hurricane, earthquake, or other natural disasters, acts of public enemies, curtailment of transportation facilities, political upheavals, civil disorders, outbreak of infectious disease or illness, acts of terrorism, or any similar cause beyond the control of the parties shall not be deemed a breach of this Agreement. In such an event, the Agreement shall be deemed terminated and the Sponsors shall refund to TRF all unexpended global grant funds within 30 days of termination.
5. TRF's entire responsibility is expressly limited to payment of the total financing amount. TRF does not assume any further responsibility in connection with this grant.
6. TRF reserves the right to cancel the grant and/or this Agreement without notice upon the failure of either or both of the Sponsors to abide by the terms set forth in this Agreement and the Terms and Conditions. Upon cancellation, TRF shall be entitled to a refund from the Sponsors of any global grant funds, including any interest earned, that have not been expended.

7. The laws of the State of Illinois, USA, without reference to its conflicts of laws principles, shall govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including, without limitation, its interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement.
8. Any legal action brought by either party against the other party arising out of or relating to this Agreement must be brought in either, the Circuit Court of Cook County, State of Illinois, USA or the Federal District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, USA. Each party consents to the exclusive jurisdiction of these courts, and their respective appellate courts for the purpose of such actions. Nothing herein prohibits a party that obtains a judgment in either of the designated courts from enforcing the judgment in any other court. Notwithstanding the foregoing, TRF may also bring legal action against Sponsors and/or individuals traveling on grant funds in any court with jurisdiction over them.
9. This Agreement binds and benefits the parties and their respective administrators, legal representatives, and permitted successors and assigns.
10. If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.
11. Sponsors may not assign any of their rights under this Agreement except with the prior written consent of TRF. Sponsors may not delegate any performance under this Agreement without the prior written consent of TRF. Any purported assignment of a Sponsor's rights or delegation of performance without TRF's prior written consent is void.
