## Project Overview

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**Tell us a little about your project. What are the main objectives of the project, and who will benefit from it?**

**Current Situation**

Chiayi County faces a critical healthcare challenge as Taiwan's most rapidly aging region. Since 2017, it has consistently ranked as the county with the severest population aging in Taiwan. As of December 2023, Taiwan's overall aging index is 154, while Chiayi County's stands at an alarming 263, far exceeding the national average of 71%. With the nation's highest elderly population ratio at 22.36%, Chiayi County is experiencing a significant increase in chronic diseases and heightened medical needs among its residents.

**Ophthalmology Challenges:**

In the field of ophthalmology, diabetes presents a significant risk, particularly for the elderly population. Conditions such as diabetic retinopathy and macular degeneration often progress silently, with symptoms only becoming apparent after substantial damage has occurred. While regular eye exams can reduce the risk of blindness by 50%, access to care is limited. Only 5 out of 18 towns in Chiayi County offer ophthalmology services, with just 11 clinics and 3 hospitals available. This scarcity of medical resources, combined with inadequate transportation infrastructure, creates significant barriers for residents seeking timely eye care.

**Dental Health Concerns:**

Oral health is a crucial indicator of overall well-being and quality of life. The Ministry of Health and Welfare reports that adults aged 50-64 frequently suffer from periodontal disease. For the elderly population, issues such as tissue aging, tooth wear, and worsening periodontal disease can severely impact chewing and swallowing functions. This not only leads to poor nutrition and increased chronic disease risk but also affects self-esteem and social interactions, posing a severe threat to the overall health and quality of life for Chiayi's aging

population.

In 2022, Chiayi County faced a severe shortage of dental professionals, with only 98 dentists serving a population of 487,550 - a ratio of 1 dentist per 4,975 residents. This stark contrast with Chiayi City, where each dentist serves an average of 1,105 residents, highlights the significant urban-rural healthcare divide. The county's vast rural and agricultural areas suffer from inadequate medical resources, exacerbated by ongoing population outflow. Vulnerable groups, including the elderly, women, children, and foreign workers, often neglect oral health due to geographical, occupational, and educational barriers.

**Critical Equipment Needs:**

The Dongshi Health Center, a crucial healthcare provider in the region, urgently requires modernization. Its outdated dental X-ray equipment frequently malfunctions, compromising patient care. Acquiring new high-performance AI ophthalmology equipment and modern dental X-ray machines is costly. Dongshi Health Center struggles to raise the necessary funds and seeks assistance from Rotary International to enhance its ophthalmology and dental diagnostic services. With support from the health center's medical staff, residents in rural areas can receive timely and appropriate eye and dental care, strengthening rural health care and advancing health equity.

##### Describe the community needs that your project will address.

The Dongshi Health Center urgently requires modernization. Its outdated dental X-ray equipment frequently malfunctions, compromising patient care. Acquiring new high-performance AI ophthalmology equipment and modern dental X-ray machines is costly. Dongshi Health Center struggles to raise the necessary funds and seeks assistance from Rotary International to enhance its ophthalmology and dental diagnostic services. With support from the health center's medical staff, residents in rural areas can receive timely and appropriate eye and dental care, strengthening rural health care and advancing health equity.

##### How did your project team identify these needs?

The staff of the Southern Division of National Health Insurance Administration visited the Dongshi Health Center to do field survey.

The investigation report is as follows:

1. According to the research, the local health center is located in remote town, with inconvenient transportation and surrounded by fields. There are few medical clinics and dental clinics nearby. Most of the residents are disadvantaged people or from low-income family.
2. The proportion of the elderly population in the local community is quite high. When these elderly residents have vision or dental problems, they must go to distant towns or the city, so they usually delay or neglect the medical service due to various inconvenience such as transportation issues.

##### How were members of the benefiting community involved in finding solutions?

1. The remote area community residents can be directly taken care by in-local -health-center based eye and dental care. Health-center-based provide access and treatment modalities to enable medical professionals to provide a range of eye and dental care. It makes it easier for residents to receive care because they don't have to travel to an appointment.
2. Collaborative efforts across sectors to establish eye and dental treatment facilities, along with environmental improvements and space enhancements, should increase medical professionals willingness to provide services in remote areas.

##### How were community members involved in planning the project?

The Dongshi Health Center assists in propagating the eye and dental treatment resources and ask for the village chief, local powerful people and relevant government departments to assist in propagating and letting more vulnerable residents know the in-local based health center which will benefit more community residents in need.

The Dongshi Health Center can cooperate with other groups including the government, non-profit organizations and private companies to increase efficiency.

Ophthalmology:

1.Optimize Rural Medical Service Quality: Utilize AI high-performance fundus instruments at Dongshi Health

Center to assist in vision examinations, aiding in diagnosis without the need for mydriatic agents, thus reducing examination time and discomfort.

2.Reduce the Risk of Vision Loss: Annual fundus examinations can lead to early detection and treatment of diabetic retinopathy and other complications, lowering the risk of blindness by 50%.

Dentistry:

1.Enhance Accessibility of Rural Medical Services: With upgraded equipment, the Dental Association can dispatch dentists for regular visits, offering treatments for oral diseases, root canals, cleanings, abnormal case referrals, prosthetics, and comprehensive periodontal exams. This enables residents to receive care locally, eliminating the need for long-distance travel.

2.Strengthen Rural Health Care Systems: Ensuring residents receive professional dental care locally promotes overall health equity.

**How were these needs identified?**

Residents in rural areas face barriers to access medical service due to the geographic location and their poor health literacy. We require practical and flexible approaches to distribute experienced professionals in this field for providing eye and dental services in rural areas.

## Authorizations

#### Legal agreement

Global Grant Agreement - to be authorized by the primary contacts and club presidents (or DRFC chairs if district-sponsored)

This Global Grant Agreement (Agreement) is entered into by The Rotary Foundation of Rotary International (TRF) and the grant sponsors (Sponsors). In consideration of receiving this Rotary Foundation Global Grant (Grant) from TRF, the Sponsors agree that:

1. All information contained in this application is, to the best of our knowledge, true and accurate.
2. We have read the Terms and Conditions for Rotary Foundation Global Grants (Terms and Conditions) and will adhere to all policies therein.
3. The Sponsors shall defend, indemnify, and hold harmless Rotary International (RI) and TRF, including their respective directors, trustees, officers, committee members, employees, agents, associate foundations and representatives (collectively Rotary), from and against all claims, including but not limited to claims of subrogation, demands, actions, damages, losses, costs, liabilities, expenses (including reasonable attorney's fees and other legal expenses), awards, judgments, and fines asserted against or recovered from Rotary arising out of any act, conduct, omission, negligence, misconduct, or unlawful act (or act contrary to any applicable governmental order or regulation) resulting directly or indirectly from a Sponsor's and/or participant's involvement in grant-funded activities, including all travel related to the grant.
4. The failure of the parties to comply with the terms of this Agreement due to an act of God, strike, government regulation, war, fire, riot, civil unrest, hurricane, earthquake, or other natural disasters, acts of public enemies, curtailment of transportation facilities, political upheavals, civil disorders, outbreak of infectious disease or illness, acts of terrorism, or any similar cause beyond the control of the parties shall not be deemed a breach of this Agreement. In such an event, the Agreement shall be deemed terminated and the

Sponsors shall refund to TRF all unexpended global grant funds within 30 days of termination.

5. TRF's entire responsibility is expressly limited to payment of the total financing amount. TRF does not assume any further responsibility in connection with this grant.

6. TRF reserves the right to cancel the grant and/or this Agreement without notice upon the failure of either or both of the Sponsors to abide by the terms set forth in this Agreement and the Terms and Conditions. Upon cancellation, TRF shall be entitled to a refund from the Sponsors of any global grant funds, including any interest earned, that have not been expended.

7. The laws of the State of Illinois, USA, without reference to its conflicts of laws principles, shall govern all matters arising out of or relating to this Agreement, including, without limitation, its interpretation, construction, performance, and enforcement.

8. Any legal action brought by either party against the other party arising out of or relating to this Agreement must be brought in either, the Circuit Court of Cook County, State of Illinois, USA or the Federal District Court for the Northern District of Illinois, USA. Each party consents to the exclusive jurisdiction of these courts, and their respective appellate courts for the purpose of such actions. Nothing herein prohibits a party that obtains a judgment in either of the designated courts from enforcing the judgment in any other court. Notwithstanding the foregoing, TRF may also bring legal action against Sponsors and/or individuals traveling on grant funds in any court with jurisdiction over them.

9. This Agreement binds and benefits the parties and their respective administrators, legal representatives, and permitted successors and assigns.

10. If any provision of this Agreement is determined to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, the remaining provisions of this Agreement shall remain in full force and effect.

11. Sponsors may not assign any of their rights under this Agreement except with the prior written consent of TRF. Sponsors may not delegate any performance under this Agreement without the prior written consent of TRF. Any purported assignment of a Sponsor's rights or delegation of performance without TRF's prior written consent is void.

12. TRF may assign some or all of its rights under this Agreement to an associate foundation of TRF. TRF may delegate any performance under this Agreement to an associate foundation. Any other purported assignment of TRF's rights or delegation of performance without the Sponsors' prior written consent is void.

13. Sponsors will comply with all economic and trade sanctions, including those implemented by the Office of Foreign Assets Control (OFAC) of the United States Department of Treasury, and will ensure that they do not support or promote violence, terrorist activity or related training, or money laundering.

14. This Agreement constitutes the final agreement between the parties. No amendment or waiver of any provision of this Agreement shall be effective unless it is in the form of a writing signed by the parties.

15. Rotary may use information contained in this application and subsequent reports for promotional purposes, such as in Rotary magazine, in Rotary Leader, on rotary.org and on social media. For any and all photographs submitted with any application or follow-up report, the Sponsor hereby grants to Rotary an unlimited, perpetual, worldwide right and license to use, modify, adapt, publish, and distribute the photograph(s) in any media now known or hereafter devised, including but not limited to, in Rotary publications, advertisements, and Websites and on social media channels. The Sponsor represents and warrants that (a) each adult appearing in the photograph(s) has given her/his/their unrestricted written consent to the Sponsor to photograph them and to use and license their likeness, including licensing the photograph(s) to third parties, (b) the parent or guardian of each child under age 18 or each person who lacks legal capacity appearing in the photograph(s) has given unrestricted written consent to the Sponsor to photograph the child or individual and to use and license their likenesses, including licensing the photograph(s) to third parties, and (c) it is the copyright owner of the photograph(s) or that the copyright owner of the photograph(s) has given the Sponsor the right to license or sublicense the photograph(s) to Rotary.
